Discussion and Questions	Cllr Judy Peace chaired the questions and points were raised by various Councillors including: • update on A386 corridor improvements • meeting targets on affordable homes • affordable housing thresholds, primary residence and second homes • the impact of the government's decision to get rid of housing target numbers • capacity of existing infrastructure, particularly sewage and importance of liaising with SW Water. Please note for clarification while SW Water are engaged in plan making and the Infrastructure Needs Assessment they are not a statutory consultee for purposes of planning applications • internet shopping is changing patterns and type of uses now in demand and is having impact on waste issues in relation to recycling of cardboard • flood risk and importance of up to date information and modelling in allocating sites and how outline schemes move through the application process working with the lead local flood authority
